

Les Sklaroff was a meticulous collector and specialist in Mervyn Peake's writings, poetry, art and illustrations. From childhood, Les was drawn into Peake's fantasy worlds, with his imagery and influence a theme through many of Les' artistic and literary pursuits. The Peake collection that Les amassed was started in the late 1950s but continued growing over the following seven decades. Les was in regular correspondence with the Peake family over the years, and with a completist's eye, contributed to several Peake bibliographies. Les was a passionate collector and dealer in books, a loving father and a devoted grandfather. He passed away in May 2025 at the age of 85.

His family hope that these treasured items are coveted as much by other admirers of Peake, as they were by Les.

1. Gormenghast. Original draft typescript of chapters 8 to 19 with numerous manuscript revisions and additions in ink. 189 sheets, mostly foolscap, [1948-49]. These correspond to pp.42-127 of the published text, and comprise fourteen distinct episodes: some of which have headings which were later omitted: 'The Imprisoned Twins', 'The Coloured Bannisters', 'Flukes Cradle', 'Deadyawn', 'Death of a Theorist', 'The Colour Chapters', 'The Escapade'. Eleven pages are largely or entirely in the author's own hand, including the Professors' 'obscure chant of former days', which begins: "Hold fast / To the law / Of the last / Cold tome, / Where the earth / Of the truth / Lies thick / On the page...", typifying the ancient stultified rituals of the castle.

Provenance: purchased by Leslie Sklaroff in 1987 from James Ellis. In Elizabeth Pulford's Richard Llewellyn Stewart-Jones as remembered by his friends, James Ellis remembers: "We went with Richard to Stone Hall - an escapade of high order - for ivy stripping and jungle clearing on a scale I had never before contemplated. Mervyn Peake was living in the stables." In subsequent correspondence (see below) James Ellis adds "I never met Mervyn & when I asked to because I had enjoyed his book [Titus Groan] Richard was vague. "He's not always there - doesn't like to be disturbed - perhaps next week-end etc. Mervyn may well have been living in Chelsea at the time & using Stone Hall for week-ending. It was typical of Richard S-J to help his friends by letting them use his places like that."

In 1979 Esther Darlington, a friend and also a former Chelsea tenant of Richard Stewart-Jones, delivered to Maeve Peake the typescript of the first few chapters of Gormenghast., which had presumably been found very belatedly at Stone Hall, and were subsequently lodged with University College London.

Of the present typescript, which had evidently been unearthed at a different time, James Ellis writes: "These [papers] came to me I can't remember when from R.L.S-J. ... How Richard came by them I can only speculate - possibly clearing up at Stone Hall after Peake left."

About Stone Hall (Oxted, Surrey) Elizabeth Pulford writes, in a letter dated 15 December 1986: "... the people who bought Stone Hall from Richard... put plumbing into the stables in which they lived, about 1950, while work was done on the house which was in a very bad state & which was pulled down after a fire before they could move into it. Apparently another owner rebuilt it later."

Two to Norah [Nicholson of Chatto & Windus], feeling "so stupid and remorseful" about his "goings-on", having missed a supper party after dropping a boiling kettle on his foot and accepting an invitation, "I feel so silly & sorry at my apparent churlishness when I saw you last, but this Thursday would have been frightfully difficult although I wanted to come. Am working very hard on the 2nd Book of Groan & am very excited with ideas ..." with a drawing of a cherub firing arrows at a parson's nose, a fish and tropical island in the background; one to Hermann Shriva, "This is a voice out of a wilderness of self-reproach - a voice from a damned soul - am I not? For if not quite damned in your eyes please let me know at once.", inviting him for coffee and to choose a "long delayed drawing", with a drawing of a creature with a bird-like head and wings, wearing dungarees, a flower in a pot and a frog (adapted for the Cameron House Books logo); one to Alan F. Guest, with envelope, "... I am especially happy that you like my Titus bks. The 3rd part is being published next summer. I hope you will like it equally. I've lost all track of "All This & Bevin Too" and haven't a copy myself & only have one copy of Rh without Reason...", with a character drawing titled "Mr. Flay"; three [to the Society of Authors] asking for advice regarding agreements and contracts with publishers and film rights for *Captain Slaughterboard Drops Anchor* and *Titus Groan*, all in very nice condition.




